Mary Anne White OC FRSC is a scientist, promoter of science, writer, choral singer, wife, mother and grandmother. After more than 30 years as a professor in chemistry and physics at Dalhousie University, she now holds the title Harry Shirreff Professor of Chemical Research (*Emerita*).

Mary Anne has been active throughout her career in bringing science to the general public: helping establish the hands-on Discovery Centre in Halifax; making presentations for schools, the general public and others (including a lecture for Members of Canada's Parliament and Senate in the Bacon & Egghead series); writing booklets on science activities for children and more than 70 articles for educators or the general public; making appearances on television and radio. For 14 years she was a regular on CBC Radio's Maritime Noon, answering listeners' science questions.
